SERCAT 2

What is SERCAT 2?

Members of the Reserve Forces who do not render service and have no service obligation. They are liable for call out.

SERCAT 2 groups members who remain in the ADF, but have no commitment to render service, other than call out. It represents the standby component of the ADF.

A number of Permanent members (ie those who have served in SERCAT 6 or 7) are required to transfer to SERCAT 2 when they cease Permanent service. This depends on when they joined the ADF. Where a member does not transfer to SERCAT 3, 4 or 5 on leaving the Permanent Forces, they may be obligated to serve in SERCAT 2 for a specified period.

As a SERCAT 2 member:

- you are not rendering service and do not need to maintain Individual Readiness.
- you are liable for SERVOP C (CFTS), if 'call out' provisions are enacted by the Governor-General.
- you are eligible to apply to transfer to another SERCAT if you wish to render service.

Tools such as [ForceNet](#) and Service Reserve websites can be used to search for Reserve job opportunities and to keep your personal details, as well as a record of your military and civilian training and skills up to date.

Conditions of service

You will not receive:

- Salary
- Superannuation
- Tax-Free Pay
- Defence Home Owner Assistance Scheme (DHOAS)
- Other Allowances
- Housing/accommodation support *
- Health & medical
- Access to leave
- Career oversight

* Members may have residual benefits from service in previous SERCATs

Applicable transfers

From SERCAT 2 you can apply to transfer to SERCATs 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7

Applicable SERVOPs

While in SERCAT 2, no SERVOPs are applicable. You will need to transfer to another SERCAT to be eligible for SERVOPs.
